Projects in this list include both flood-management-focused projects and Integrated Water Management (IWM) projects. The list of Local Planned Projects was compiled from numerous sources. Agencies identified projects in their long-term plans during meetings with the Information Gathering teams. Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Plan reports and IWM planning documents were used as primary references for planned and ongoing flood projects in each county. Because the intent was to approximate remaining flood infrastructure funding needs, county

and city CIP budget reports and websites were also reviewed. Other sources for planned flood and/or conjunctive use projects were Proposition 1E and 84 project application lists, and the American Society of Civil Engineers report cards.
